The Workbook is on a flash drive in a user-friendly e-book, with a separate PDF file for printing all or portions of the Workbook. Separate Word files include the questionnaires for coaches, staff, and student-athletes, and charts for recording information. The questionnaires may be transmitted and completed in Word, while athletics program information may be recorded on the charts, also in Word.
